

Do I need a paper boarding pass from Lufthansa?(((VIP-Travel)))

Whether you need a paper boarding pass from Lufthansa largely depends on the airport you are departing from, your device compatibility, and your personal preference, but in most cases, you do not need a paper boarding pass, because Lufthansa fully accepts mobile boarding passes on the vast majority of its routes and at most airports worldwide. Lufthansa has designed its digital boarding system so travelers can store their boarding pass on their smartphone through the Lufthansa app or a digital wallet platform, such as Apple Wallet or Google Wallet, and these mobile passes are easily scanned at security checkpoints, airport lounges, and boarding gates. For many passengers, this digital option is not only sufficient but also more convenient, as it reduces the risk of misplacing a paper document and allows quick, easy access at every stage of the airport process. Digital boarding passes typically remain available offline once downloaded or saved to a digital wallet, so you can access them even when the airport's Wi-Fi is slow or your mobile connection is limited. While mobile passes work for most Lufthansa flights, some circumstances still require or strongly benefit from having a paper boarding pass. For example, a small number of airports—particularly some smaller regional airports, older terminals, or certain international destinations—may not support mobile scanning technology at security or boarding gates. When that happens, Lufthansa may notify passengers during online check-in that mobile boarding passes are not accepted at that airport, prompting travelers to print a paper version at home or pick one up from a self-service kiosk once they arrive. Another scenario where a paper boarding pass may be necessary is when traveling to destinations with additional document checks, such as visa verification or special travel documentation requirements, where airport staff might need to physically stamp or review the boarding pass. Additionally, passengers traveling with pets, unaccompanied minors, medical equipment, or special service requests may be required to check in at the counter, where Lufthansa staff may print a paper boarding pass to ensure all requirements have been reviewed. Even though a paper pass is not mandatory for most travelers, it can be a useful backup. Many passengers prefer printing one as a precaution in case their phone battery dies, their screen becomes damaged, or they run into unexpected issues accessing their mobile pass. Taking a screenshot or saving the mobile boarding pass offline is highly recommended, but having a printed copy can offer added reassurance, especially on long travel days with multiple connections. Lufthansa also makes it simple to reprint a boarding pass if needed—self-service kiosks at most major airports allow you to print your pass by scanning your passport, entering your booking details, or using your frequent-flyer number. For passengers who check in through the Lufthansa website, the airline provides a downloadable PDF that can be printed at home, and this option remains accessible through the “My Bookings” section. Another factor to consider is lounge access. Lufthansa lounges and Star Alliance partner lounges accept both mobile and paper passes, but some third-party lounges—especially those at smaller airports or run by independent operators—may prefer a printed version if their

scanning technology is outdated or inconsistent. While Lufthansa supports mobile boarding across its own network, some partner airlines may have limitations, meaning a combination of digital and paper boarding passes may be required.
