The Lufthansa Airlines Name Change Policy begins with the core rule that the name on your The ticket must exactly match the name on your passport. When travelers notice even a single-letter

Many flyers panic when they realize their middle name is missing or incorrectly placed on their Lufthansa reservation. Although Lufthansa typically does not require a middle name for boarding, certain destinations—particularly the U.S., Canada, and parts of the Middle East—enforce full-name matching. During these situations, travelers contact the documentation team at

A very common scenario involves travelers using nicknames during booking, only to realize later that Lufthansa prohibits informal names on international tickets. Legal name changes caused by marriage, divorce, government decree, or gender transition fall under Lufthansa's document-based name change policy, which is more flexible than standard edits. When a traveler's surname has officially changed, Lufthansa allows reissuance without penalties in many fare types. orders for approval. Many travelers discover this policy while searching "Lufthansa update married last name on existing international ticket"—a high-ranking keyword.

Occasionally, a passenger realizes that the first and last names were reversed during booking, often due to auto-fill errors. swap correction, as reversed names can cause automatic check-in failures and boarding pass rejections.

Some corrections become urgent when the Lufthansa system locks the booking after check-in is attempted.
